Purpose and Aim

Future Leaders International Private School Branch 2 is committed to delivering a curriculum that is broad, balanced, creative, and inclusive, promoting academic excellence and holistic development for all students. FLIS Branch 2 is accredited by WASC and AISS and affiliated the College Board (AP/PSAT/SAT programs). Our curriculum is designed to align with both national and international standards, including the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) and the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), ensuring that students are well-prepared for success in higher education and the global workforce. This policy is developed in accordance with the Abu Dhabi Department of Education and Knowledge (ADEK) regulations and reflects the specific needs and context of FLIS Branch 2.

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to outline the structure and implementation of the FLIS Branch 2 curriculum, ensuring it provides:

- A high-quality education that supports students in becoming independent, collaborative learners who achieve their full potential.
- A curriculum that incorporates CCSS and NGSS standards, providing authentic learning experiences that meet world-class educational standards.
- A clear framework for compulsory and elective subjects, including a wide range of extracurricular
- activities that support students' interests, abilities, and career aspirations.
- Integration of UAE culture and national identity, equipping students with the skills and values necessary for contributing to nation-building and meeting national priorities.
- Defined roles and responsibilities for all stakeholders involved in curriculum implementation and management.





Definitions

Academic Plan

A comprehensive plan that outlines the academic focus of the school, including its mission, vision, core values, goals, teaching methods, instructional materials, curriculum content, timetables, policies, and accreditation.

Accreditation

A quality assurance process where an external body evaluates a school to determine whether it meets rigorous educational standards.

Additional Learning Needs

Requirements for additional support or accommodations within the school setting for students with special educational needs, disabilities, or other barriers to learning.

Attainment

The level of academic achievement students reach on assessments, recorded as grades, scores, or levels.

Common Core State Standards (CCSS)

A set of academic standards in mathematics and English language arts/literacy (ELA) that outline what a student should know and be able to do at the end of each grade level.

Compulsory Subjects/Courses

Mandatory subjects or courses required for the successful completion of a grade or year level.

Course

Organized units of study within a subject that meet educational requirements.

Core-related Electives: Cycle 3 electives linked to English/Math/Science pathways (e.g., Business, Psychology, Sociology, World History).

Course Catalog: An official publication that outlines all academic courses available to students for a given school year. It includes detailed descriptions of each course, including prerequisites, credit value, grade level eligibility, course duration (semester, term, or year-long), and how the course fulfills graduation requirements.



Course Syllabus:

A detailed instructional guide provided by the teacher at the beginning of a course that outlines the expectations, content, structure, and policies for that specific course. It typically includes the course description, learning objectives, grading criteria, required materials, major assignments and assessments, classroom rules, and a timeline or pacing guide.

Cross-Curricular

An intentional effort to apply knowledge, skills, and concepts across multiple academic subjects simultaneously.

Curriculum

The intended, enacted, assessed, and learned academic content based on national standards, including the learning standards, objectives, and instructional materials used.

Curriculum Map

A description of the horizontal and vertical plan for a subject's educational standards, skills, and concepts taught over the academic year.

Educational Program

A teaching and learning framework organized to achieve specific learning objectives over a sustained period.

Equivalency

The process by which the UAE Ministry of Education officially endorses a secondary school certificate as equivalent to the UAE General Education Certificate (Al Thanawiya).

Extracurricular Activities (ECA)

Organized activities that complement the school curriculum, including sports, clubs, competitions, performances, and field trips.

Learning Pathways

Specific courses, subjects, and learning experiences tailored to meet individual student interests, abilities, and aspirations.





Multilingual Learners

Students who are acquiring the language of instruction and require additional support to overcome language barriers.

Scope and Sequence

The breadth and depth of the curriculum and the order of content and skills to ensure prerequisite learning is mastered before progressing to the next level.

Transcript: Official record for Cycle 3 (G9–12) showing courses, credits, term grades, GPAs (weighted/unweighted), and graduation progress.

UAE General Education Certificate (Shahadat Al-Thawasiya Al-Amma)

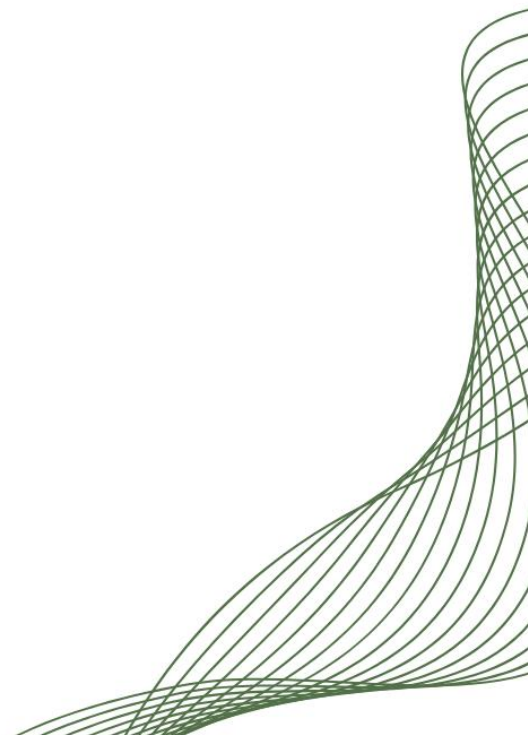
A certificate awarded upon the successful completion of UAE's general secondary education, covering grades 10, 11, and 12.

Units of Instruction

A well-defined portion of an instructional course focusing on specific learning outcomes and skills.

Yearly Plan

A curriculum map for one subject in one grade level over an academic year.





Roles and Responsibilities

School Principal

The Principal is responsible for overseeing the development, implementation, and monitoring of the curriculum. This includes ensuring that the curriculum aligns with ADEK regulations, CCSS, NGSS, and the school's mission and vision. The Principal also leads the Curriculum Committee and ensures that all instructional resources are appropriate and effective.

Curriculum Committee

The Curriculum Committee, chaired by the Principal, is responsible for reviewing and updating the curriculum to ensure it meets the educational needs of all students. The committee includes heads of departments, the CU Guidance Counselor, and teachers who collaborate to ensure curriculum coherence and alignment with standards.

Heads of Departments (HODs)

HODs are responsible for implementing the curriculum within their subject areas, ensuring alignment with CCSS, NGSS, and ADEK standards. They oversee lesson planning, assessment development, and resource selection to support effective teaching and learning.

Teachers

Teachers are responsible for delivering the curriculum in accordance with the school's academic plan. They create lesson plans that align with CCSS, NGSS, and ADEK standards, differentiate instruction to meet the needs of all students, and assess student progress regularly.

CU Guidance Counselor

The CU Guidance Counselor plays a crucial role in supporting students' academic and career planning. They assist students in selecting courses that align with their career aspirations and ensure that students meet graduation and equivalency requirements.

Students

Students are expected to engage actively in their learning, complete assignments, and participate in assessments. They should take advantage of the opportunities provided by the curriculum to explore their interests and develop their skills.

Parents

Parents are encouraged to support their children's learning by staying informed about the curriculum, attending school events, and communicating regularly with teachers and school staff.





Academic Plan

The FLIS Branch 2 Academic Plan is structured to provide a comprehensive and cohesive educational experience that aligns with CCSS, NGSS, and ADEK standards. The plan includes:

- Provision of academic support, interventions, and guidance tailored to each student's needs, ensuring they achieve their full potential.

Subjects Taught

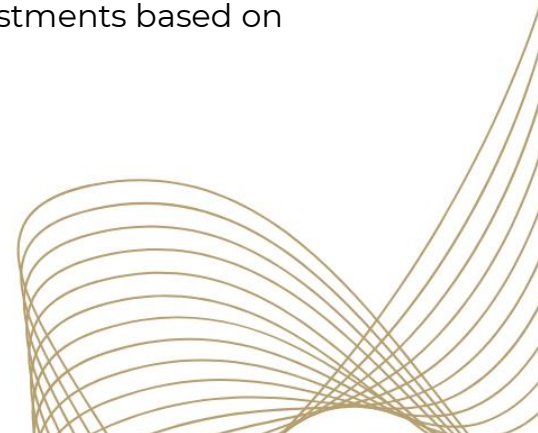
FLIS Branch 2 offers a comprehensive range of subjects that align with CCSS, NGSS and ADEK standards. In addition, FLIS Branch 2 offers AP in high school. These subjects include:

- Core Subjects: English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Arabic, which are compulsory for all students. The curriculum for these subjects is designed to meet the requirements of CCSS and NGSS, ensuring that students develop the necessary skills and knowledge to succeed.
- Elective Courses: A wide range of elective courses is offered, including Physical Education, Arts, Music, ICT, French, Psychology and sociology. These courses provide students with opportunities to explore their interests and develop additional skills.
- UAE MOE Subjects: Arabic Language, Islamic Studies, and UAE Social Studies are taught to promote a deep understanding of UAE culture and national identity, in compliance with ADEK and MoE requirements.

Curriculum Design and Implementation
